Most of the items in this collection are from northern Nigeria and reflect the lifestyle of the nomadic Fulani people.

<b>3 x Working Women</b>	These models depict women working. Note that they work while carrying their babies in slings on their backs.		
<b>3 x Gourd Dishes</b>	Made from half gourds and decorated.		
<b>Brush</b>	Made from grasses and bound with twine.		
<b>2 x Carved Models</b>	Land rover and woman mixing in large dish – decorative.		
<b>5 x Model Tools</b>	Models of agricultural tools with decorated handles.		
<b>Kalabash Flask</b>	Decorated with okra net – could be used as musical instrument.		
<b>2 x Head Rings</b>	Used for carrying heavy items (water jugs, bales etc).		
<b>Leather Wallet</b>	Hand made and decorated with inlaid leather strips.		
<b>Leather Purse</b>	Hand sewn with decorated hems.		
<b>2 x Wall Decorations</b>	Printed with traditional figures.		
<b>Cloth Strip</b>	Printed and embroidered with coloured cotton bobbles. Used as either a hammock, a bed/chair decoration or a scarf. The type of decoration denotes status (importance) to the Yoruba people.		
<b>Elephant Stool/Table</b>	Hand carved from local wood.		
<b>1 x Woven Basket &amp; Lid</b>			
<b>4 x Woven Dishes</b>			
<b>2 x Woven Platters</b>	Could be used as winnowing baskets.		
<b>1 x Woven Flask</b>			
<b>Face Mask</b>	Hand carved and used as a wall decoration.		
<b>3 x Handbags</b>			
<b>3 x Traditional Men's Hats</b>	Hand sewn, worn as part of traditional costume; visiting mosque.		
<b>Men's Outfit</b>	Trousers, long shirt & hat.		
<b>Mbum with Photo &amp; Text</b>	A traditional men's hat worn during the annual hunting festival.		
<b>7 x Cloth Pieces</b>	Printed with traditional patterns – 'Kampala'.		
<b>3 x Cloth Smocks</b>	Printed with traditional patterns – 'Kampala attire'.		
<b>1 x Cloth Dress</b>	Printed with traditional pattern.		
<b>Leather Holdall</b>	Decorated with traditional patterns.		
<b>2 x Leather Cushions</b>	Green and white.		
<b>13 x Books</b>	The Distant Talking Drum. My Grandfather is a Magician. One Big Family. Ebele's Favourite. Emeka's Gift. Saying Goodbye. A is for Africa. Music & Musical Instruments. Benin, An African Kingdom. A Flavour Of West Africa. Introducing Nigeria. The Changing Face Of Nigeria. Ikenna Goes To Nigeria.

<b>2 x Bamboo Style Trays</b>	Typically used in the home.

<b>Leather Fan</b>	Multicoloured leather with dyed green ostrich feathers.		
<b>Assorted Bead Necklaces</b>	In plastic bag		
<b>Nigerian Flag</b>	In plastic bag
