<b>Djellaba</b>	A full length garment with hood – the most common dress for men.		
<b>Sandals</b>	In Northern Morocco, traditionally worn with the backs down.		
<b>Teapot and Tray</b>	When you order tea in Morocco, expect to wait for some time and be prepared for a very sweet concoction. Tea is added to the pot at the same time as the boiling water, followed by lots of sugar and a sprig of mint. When bartering (for example with an artisan for a rug), it is usual to discuss the price over endless cups of this kind of tea.		
<b>Glasses (Box of 5)</b>	For drinking tea made as above.		
<b>Brule Parfin</b>	Incense burner found in many North African homes. The incense is sprinkled on hot charcoal placed in the globe. The tray is decorated with typical Islamic patterns.		
<b>Tajine</b>	Casserole dish (uniquely Moroccan) with a conical cover. Used to cook the spicy stew tajine and other meals such as couscous.		
<b>Tajine Dish and Burner</b>	Typical ochre coloured casserole dish and charcoal burner used by the Berbers in the Atlas mountains. Less elaborate than the decorated tajines common in the towns. Tajine is a spicy meat or fish stew. (Kept separately due to size & weight – available on request).		
<b>Decorated Pot</b>	Small clay pot covered with leather. A decorative item sold widely to tourists.		
<b>5 x Books</b>	Lonely Planet Guide to Morocco. Five Things To Find – a story from Tunisia. The Bachelor and the Bean – a Jewish Moroccan folk tale. The Hundredth Name. Boushra's Day – from dawn to dusk in an Egyptian city.		
<b>Photographs</b>	2 large laminated photos – Berbers.		
<b>Clear Plastic Wallet</b>	3 x laminated information sheets – Weavers of North Africa and the Middle East. 5 x laminated photos. North Africa – laminated info sheet. Display labels for some of the above items.		
<b>Green Plastic Wallet</b>	Cairo, Four Children and their City. Booklet and 22 laminated photos.
