A Training Course for Rights-Respecting Schools and Schools engaged in Children's Rights work in Somerset

The Somerset Rights Respecting Global Citizens (RRGC) course:

- Provides a series of **CPD workshops** including: Introduction to whole school Global Citizenship; Justice or Charity?; Fair Trade; Community Cohesion & Multicultural Britain; Sustainability; Measuring Attitudinal Change in Pupils; Curriculum Planning
- Provides **professional mentoring and support** for individual schools, clusters and partnerships of schools with an interest in whole school Global Citizenship and the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). It can help schools on their RRS journey by focusing on aspects related to Global Justice and Sustainability
- Offers **Country Collection & Global Topic Box resource loans**, including advice on best use in the classroom and in curriculum planning to help embed rights-based teaching and global learning across the whole school curriculum
- Is **school-based**, suitable for all teaching and non-teaching staff including Headteachers, Senior Leaders, Teachers, Teaching Assistants, HLTAs and Governors

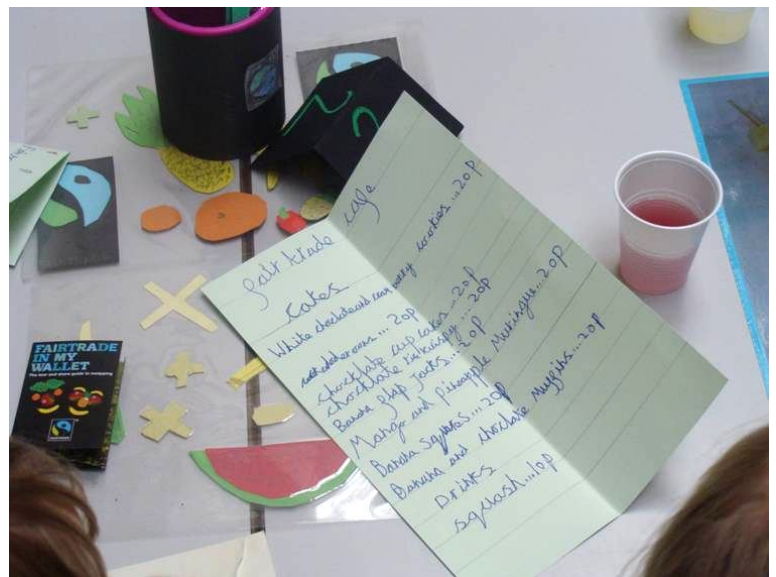
